


About us

We will tell you more about our 4 values next.


1. Support people

2. Taking part in their community




Value 2 is about people taking part in their community.



We support citizen advocates so they can work well with the person with intellectual disability.



They support people with intellectual disability to take part in their local community.



This supports them to feel

• That they belong.

3. Connect with other people



Value 3 is about connecting with other people.



We connect the person with disability with a citizen advocate.



The citizen advocate will become someone like a friend who helps and supports them.

4. Respect



Value 4 is about showing respect for other people.



We always show respect for people with disability.



We make sure everyone has a fair chance to do what they want in their community.

We thank the Western Australian Symphony Orchestra for free concert tickets for people in our program.




We thank Volunteering WA for supporting us with money to do volunteer events.

Our staff at Citizen Advocacy




These are the staff at Citizen Advocacy.

She likes to read bedtime stories to her grandchildren and cuddle with them.




Demi Crone is our coordinator.
