



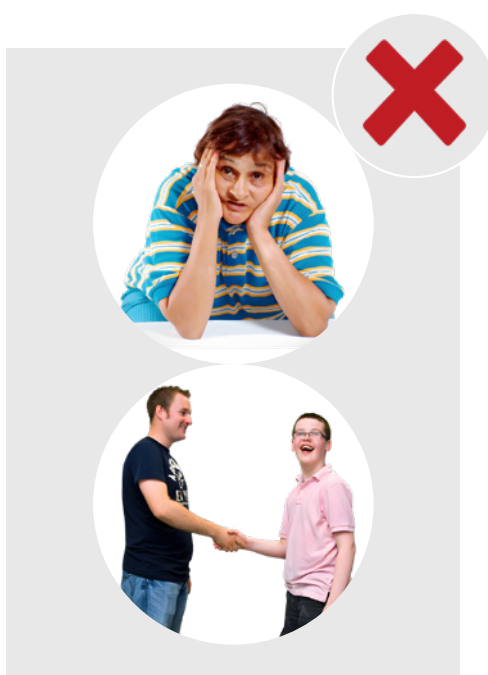

- Getting the support they need.



The person we find to support them is called a **citizen advocate**.



The **citizen advocate** will support them with things like

- Speaking up
- Taking part in what they want to do in the community.

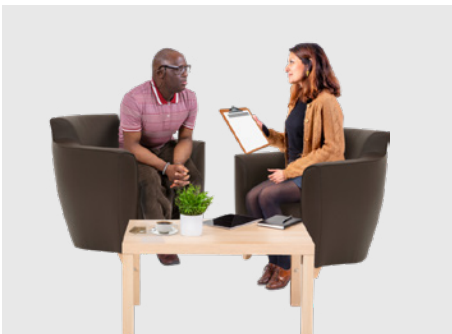
About our citizen advocates



Our citizen advocates are **volunteers** who support someone with lots of different things.



Volunteers choose to do work that is not paid.



Before someone becomes a citizen advocate we get to know them.



If they agree to be a citizen advocate we train them.



In the training they learn the skills they need to support someone well.



We then match them up with the right person to support.



We support the person and their new advocate when they are matched.

Support can be with things like



- Phone calls



- Support for you to get together



- Events to keep you in contact.

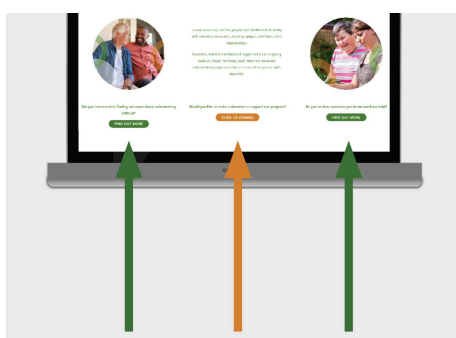

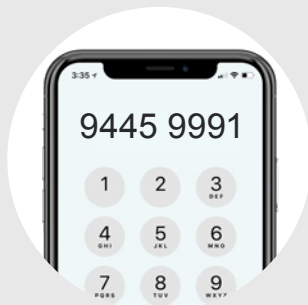
